בֵּין, between, comes from the same root as **בִּינָה**, wisdom.

Use your word knowledge, and a little **בִּינָה**, to play the following game with a partner.

Choose four color crayons. Take turns coloring in squares. To color in a square, you must first read the word and say its meaning. You must **מִבְּדִיל**, separate, **בֵּין**, between, the colors. No color can be touching a square with the same color. (If a square is colored red, the squares which surround it cannot be...) The winner is the last one to color in a square.

Example:

Player #1 says, "separates," and colors this square red.

Player #2 cannot use red for any of the squares which surround the red square. Player #2 says "between," and colors this square blue.

Student #1 says "evenings," and colors this square green.
