Torah Blessings

הקוֹתה scrolls are written by hand, on parchment, by a person called a Sofer. The אוֹרְה does not include vowels or punctuation. Some of the letters have what are called "crowns" - small decorations. A אוֹרְה created today looks the same as one created 1,500 years ago.

Reading אוֹרָהוֹ is an art and a skill, requiring much study.
